COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

This document outlines how Jubilee Stadium is implementing measures to prevent the transmission of Covid-19. Jubilee Stadium is aligning with provincial guidelines from the Re-Open Saskatchewan Plan and we encourage users to review guidelines presented from National or Provincial sport governing organizations (ex: Skate Canada, Hockey Canada, Saskatchewan Hockey Association, etc.).

Throughout the 2020/2021 season we will continue to adapt to any new guidelines. We ask that all user groups remain flexible as we navigate through this season. Each user group will be given a copy of the Town's protocols, and must sign and return a copy to the Town Office. It will be the user group's responsibility to assure that these protocols are being followed set forth by the Town. User groups found not to be following these protocols may be asked to leave.

General Guidelines:

- Stay home if you are showing unexplained symptoms related to Covid-19.
- Maximum gathering must not total more than the maximum gathering limit per the Public Health order:
 - 50 people per mini league, includes coaches/staff, instructors, participants from multiple teams, officials and volunteers who cannot maintain two meters of distancing at all times.
 - Maximum of 30 people on ice.
 - **Maximum of 150 spectators as long as physical distancing can be maintained.**

Arena Staff Responsibilities:

- Disinfect all high-touch surfaces including washrooms, benches, lobby seating, and light switches throughout their shifts.
- Follow physical distancing protocols.
- Sanitize dressing rooms between user groups.

Procedure for Entering the Building:

- Everyone who enters Jubilee Stadium is recommended to follow the self-assessment which can be found online at www.saskatchewan.ca/covid19.
- Spectators, public skaters, and shinny participants are asked to sign in at the book provided at the front door. This will allow us to facilitate contact tracing if necessary. Coaches, players, parents, referees will be tracked by their organization.
- Everyone is recommended to use hand sanitizer at the front entrance when entering the building.
- People are discouraged from visiting and lingering in the lobby.
- Enter through the double doors at front of building, labelled "Enter".

- Spectators will exit through the double doors at front of building labelled “Exit”.
- Participants in the following dressing rooms will exit out of the following doors:
 - Dressing Room # 1 and small room – exit out of north west door (it will be labelled)
 - Dressing Room #2 and Ref Room – exit out of north door just east of these two rooms (it will be labelled)
 - Dressing Room #3 and #4 – exit out of door on north side, it will be labelled.
 - Dressing Room (Nats) – exit out of exit doors directly out of dressing room.

User Group Conduct:

- Participants are to arrive no earlier than 20 minutes before their scheduled time.
- Participants are to remain in their dressing rooms until two minutes prior to their ice time.
- Participants are asked to exit the facility within 15 minutes of their scheduled time.
- Spitting and other similar activities are not permitted.
- Participants are encouraged to bring full water bottles. Drinking fountains will not be available, water bottle refill stations will be available. Do not share water bottles with other participants.
- Intentional contact during sport or activity must be limited.
- If there are volunteers working score clock or sound booth they will be required to sanitize hands before and after use.

Dressing Room Use:

- Dressing rooms must be cleaned up with no garbage or items left in the room.
- If participants are in the same mini-league as defined in the Sports and Activities Guidelines, physical distancing is not mandatory in the dressing rooms.
- If participants are not in the same mini-league (ex: public skating, shinny) then physical distancing is required as follows:
 - Room #1 – 11
 - Room #2 – 10
 - Room #3 – 9
 - Room #4 – 10
 - Small Room – 6
 - Nationals Room - 10
- It is recommended for participants to come dressed in their gear, but dressing rooms will be provided for use as long as social distancing is followed.

Spectator Information:

- There will be a maximum number of 30 spectators at a time.
- Spectators are not permitted in dressing room areas (unless care-givers are necessary for player support, i.e.: tie skates), players bench, or ice surface.
- Spectators must maintain distancing of at least two metres.
- Spectators are welcome to sit in the bleacher area (north-west, and south-west) or lobby area while maintaining social distancing.

Public Skate Guidelines

- Public Skaters will be participating in a “use at your own risk” environment.
- Skate tying will be limited to specified areas where distancing can be achieved.
- A maximum of 30 people allowed on ice surface.

Adult Recreational Hockey

- Physical distancing on bench will be required
- Consider modified rules to allow physical distancing.
- Mini leagues must be formed as per the Sask Re-Open Plan and every attempt should be made that the individuals involved are within the same geographical region.

Concession Operations

The arena concession is to be opened as health regulations allow and must follow all guidelines within the Re-Open Saskatchewan Plan.

Response Plan

All employees/participants/coaches/spectators are recommended to complete a self-assessment for Covid 19 symptoms, prior to attending the arena. Self assessment can be found on the Sask Government website.

Participant/coach are to follow directions from their governing body if they develop unexplained symptoms or test positive.

All positive tests will result in contact and direction from the Health Authority.

Confidentiality will always be maintained.
